




Teachers and students can sign in to TIME Edge on any device with Internet access—from tablets and Chromebooks, to laptops and desktop computers—from school or home.

Teachers can take a **60-day free trial anytime** by signing up at timeedge.com/preview.




TEACHER DASHBOARD


ASSIGN ARTICLES



Teachers can assign an article to a specific class, and select alternate reading levels for individual students to meet their specific needs.




STUDENT DASHBOARD



On the dashboard, students see which articles their teacher has assigned, and can also browse other current events articles and multimedia.




TEACHER'S GUIDE



TIME Edge editors provide a teacher's guide with discussion questions and teaching tips to help teachers align their lessons with the Common Core.




CONTENT NAVIGATION



After reading debate articles that show differing perspectives, students can voice their opinion by voting in a poll.




VIDEOS AND ARTICLES

TIME Edge supports teachers by giving students historical context, with interactive timelines that help connect the past and present.




MAPS AND PHOTO GALLERIES



Interactive content goes much deeper than articles, with maps and curated photo galleries that allow students to understand larger concepts of time and place.




PRIMARY SOURCES FROM THE TIME VAULT



TIME Edge editors pair current events with related articles from the TIME Vault archive to take content deeper and offer connections between past and present events.




PRIMARY SOURCES FROM THE TIME VAULT



With TIME Edge, teachers have access to more than 90 years of primary sources in the TIME Vault archive online.




PRIMARY SOURCES FROM THE TIME VAULT


REPORTING
